
Liquid Fuels

April Chief's Report

Dear Mr. President, Board of Directors, and General Membership,

During the month of April the company remained busy with calls for service, totaling 60 including 1 working fire in Colwyn Borough.

On April 14th, Darby Fire Company #1 and Mutual Aid Companies responded to the 300 Block of S. 4th for the reported building fire. Engine 4 arrived on scene with a crew of 6 to find a porch on fire with fire extending into the 2nd and 3rd floor interior walls, after roofers were making repairs and replacements. Crew's remained on scene for fire suppression and over haul. Crew's were in service for approximately 1 hour. There was no injuries to note at this incident.

The Pipeline is still awaiting completion on the pump issues by Halo, they're waiting for the proper tools to come in from Waterous, the overheating issue was deemed to be the impellers. They will be replaced as soon as they arrive at HALO.

Annual physicals were performed on 4/25 and 4/27 with no problem. Members who were not able to make the dates or did not meet the call total have been allotted until the end of May to turn in a note stating they've received a physical and are capable of performing all duties of a firefighter with no restrictions.

Because I am in California at a family wedding, I will be unable to make my report to Council in person on Wednesday May 15. Staying in the circa 1869 Cosmopolitan Hotel in Old Town San Diego, it is interesting to see how communities can use their history and heritage for their benefit. With imagination, planning, and courage, Darby Borough could do the same. With important history going back before William Penn, strategic location, and a transportation system connecting us to the world, we could work together toward positive common goals, and there is literally nothing we could not achieve.

As a reminder, for the past several years the Center for Historical Architecture and Design (CHAD) of the University of Maryland has sent students from their Masters Degree program to do research on buildings in Darby. That research will be part of the Vernacular Architectural Forum taking place in Philadelphia this year and will include a tour of historic sites in and around Darby on May 30. If anyone would like to help welcome our guests, please contact me.

On another note, Woodburne Mansion on Springfield Road is still standing but it is not clear for how much longer. It is one of the assets that could benefit Darby but would also require courage, planning and imagination. For further information please contact me.

Finally, the fifteenth annual OcTrolleyFest, Celebration of Transportation Heritage and Community will roll again this year on Saturday, October 12. This is the Year of the Mill in Delaware County and emphasis will be on Darby's mill heritage including the site of Pennsylvania's first water powered mill built by Swedish Governor Printz in 1645, the millrace "digged through Blunston's Meadow" before 1695, and the sites of the Griswold and Verlinden woolen mills celebrated in the song "The Darby Ram."
