FY 2017 CDBG – Development of the soccer field

The silt fence has been installed in advance of the project start-up. We are still waiting for the contractor's schedule.

2018 PA Small Water and Sewer Grant

We can begin the sewer replacement in the Chestnut St area whenever the Borough is ready to authorize it. This is a reimbursement grant. The Borough must pay the contractor first, and then request reimbursement.

2020 PA Small Water and Sewer Grant

The grant has been announced and the due date is December 13, 2019. A Resolution will be required. The project size is between \$30,000-\$500,000 and the Borough match is 15%...

Ordinary Street and Sewer Maintenance

A to U has ordered the inlet box for the inlet at Crestview/Southridge. They are also replacing the inlet on the opposite side of the street. In addition, we have applied to PennDOT for the patch repair on Ridge opposite Borough Hall. We are awaiting project approval.

MS4 Separate Storm Sewer Permit

The annual report was submitted to DEP.

Stormwater Tip:

Remember to pick up waste from your pet and dispose of it properly. The best method of disposal is to flush the waste. Leaving pet waste on the ground increases public health risks by allowing harmful bacterial and nutrients to wash into the storm drain and then eventually into local waterbodies.

September Chief's Report

Dear Mr. President, Board of Directors, and General Membership,

During the month of September the company responded to 55 calls for service. These calls included 2 working fires in Lansdowne and Sharon Hill.

On September 20th, Co. 4 was dispatched to the 100 block of Sharon Ave, in Sharon Hill for the working building fire. E4 arrived as 2nd due engine and supported E9 on fire suppression on Div. 2. Truck 4 arrived as second due truck and assisted the interior crew with overhaul and the exterior crew opening up the outside of the building. Co. 4 was in service for 2.5 hours before being released by command.

On September 22nd, Co. 4 was special called to Lansdowne Boro to assist on a working commercial fire. E4 arrived as second due engine and assisted E24 with fire suppression. Co. 4 was in service for 1 hour before being released by 19 command.

No FF injuries were reported at either incident.

FF Root is still in Firefighter 1 class at the DCESTC, if you see him please offer to assist him if he needs it.
